

Canada's Freshwater Future

BACKGROUND

The climate crisis is a water crisis. The UN IPCC states that Canada spends \$1.9 billion annually on damages caused by climate-exacerbated floods, storms, droughts, and wildfires. These mounting water issues undercut all Canadians' cultural, socio-economic, community health and security issues. Moreover, rapidly accelerating freshwater issues are already impacting Canada, including ecological integrity, food security, energy production, regional economic development, Canada-US. Relations, and municipal drinking water and wastewater systems.

AN INDEPENDENT CANADA WATER AGENCY (CWA)

Canadian freshwater management is spread over 20+ federal departments, leading to ineffective management, poor decision making and limited conflict resolution. An independent Canada Water Agency will act as a catalyst to advance the necessary water law, policy, and governance reforms needed to bring Canada's freshwater management regime into the 21st century. The Agency would work closely with and support Provinces, Territories, indigenous nations, local communities, scientists, and researchers to find the best ways to keep our water safe, clean, and well-managed.

CANADA WATER ACT

The renewal of the 50-year-old <u>Canada Water Act</u> is one important avenue to address current and future water issues, including but not limited to climate change resilience, improved ecosystem protection, Indigenous water rights and shared authority, improved governance and the evolving role of the private insurance industry in flood risk mitigation. Canada can become a leader in transboundary water management and undertake a legislative co-drafting process with Indigenous Nations rooted in reconciliation and consistent with UNDRIP.

FRESH WATER ACTION PLAN (FWAP)

Promised in the 2021 Liberal Platform, the historic \$1 billion over 10 years represents a critical and necessary investment that is necessary across Canada. Moreover, it matches our US neighbour's initiative to invest in water and recognize water security as a national threat.
